

Supporting Michigan's Children and Families for over Two Decades








- 3. Mobilization and community engagement, which allows our staff to create and support champions; identify, engage, and educate community advocates; and leverage strategic opportunities for collective action.
- 4. Direct legislative and administrative advocacy, which allows our staff to develop relationships with officials and staff; educate and influence policymakers; and connect others directly with decision-makers.
- 5. Effective organizational management, which allows Board and staff to build effective leadership; strengthen our business model, including fund development strategies; and strengthen internal systems and practices.

Where does our money come from? Michigan's Children has attracted foundation and corporate dollars from reputable organizations and in 2016 returned to hosting an annual fundraiser with the promise of creating a reliable funding stream from individual donations as well.
