Elected: Levin is serving his second two-year term in Congress after being elected in November 2018. His current term expires on Jan. 3, 2023.

Committee Appointments: Andy Levin is the vice chair of the House Education and Labor Committee, serving on its Subcommittee on Health, Employment, Labor, and Pensions, and the Subcommittee on Higher Education and Workforce Investment. Levin also serves on the House Foreign Affairs Committee, including its Subcommittee on Asia, the Pacific, and Nonproliferation.

Caucus Leadership: Deputy Whip of the Congressional Progressive Caucus and is a member of the House Task Force on Poverty and Opportunity, the Task Force on Aging and Families, as well as over a dozen other caucuses.

Political experience: Rep. Levin did not previously hold public office before entering Congress in 2019.

Biography: Levin has spent a career focused on workforce issues. He created and ran the state's "No Worker Left Behind" program, the largest job-retraining program in the country at the time, and served as staff attorney to the presidential Commission on the Future of Worker-Management Relations, and worked in the Secretary's office of the U.S. Department of Labor. Levin was an organizer for the Service Employees International Union, launched the Michigan Green Jobs Initiative, and founded a clean energy business. Levin succeeded his father, former U.S. Rep. Sandy Levin, as the Member of Congress in the 9th Michigan District. He is also the nephew of former U.S. Sen. Carl Levin of Michigan. He is a married father of four children. He has stated that he believes "that supporting families in all their forms is crucial to building a healthy, sustainable economy."
