Elected: Dingell is serving her fourth two-year term in Congress after being elected in November 2014. Her current term expires on Jan. 3, 2023.

Caucus Leadership: Senior Majority Whip; co-chair, House Democratic Policy and Communications Committee; co-chair of the Bipartisan Working Group to End Domestic Violence; vice chair, House Democratic Caucus Task Force on Aging and Families; co-chair, Great Lakes Task Force; and <u>dozens</u> of other caucus and task force appointments.

Committee Appointments: The House Committee on Energy and Commerce, including the Subcommittee on Health, the Subcommittee on Communications and Technology, the Subcommittee on Consumer Protection and Commerce, and the Subcommittee on the Environment & Climate Change; also the House Committee on Natural Resources, including the Subcommittee on National Parks, Forests, and Public Lands, and the Subcommittee on Oversight and Investigations.

Political experience: Rep. Dingell previously chaired the Wayne State University Board of Governors.

Biography: Dingell chaired the Michigan Infant Mortality Task Force and is a former board member of Michigan's Children. She also served as president of the GM Foundation, focused on creating jobs and economic growth in Southeast Michigan. Dingell has fought to include women's issues in federally-funded health research. She was married to the deceased John Dingell, who represented Michigan in Congress for 59 years, the longest service to date.
