


District 7 U.S. Rep. Tim Walberg, (R-Tipton) 117th Congress

District 7 encompasses Branch, Eaton, Hillsdale, Jackson, Lenawee and Monroe Counties, and parts of Washtenaw County.

Elected: Walberg returned to Congress in 2011. He previously served the district in 2007-2009, then lost his 2008 re-election bid. His current two-year term expires on Jan. 3, 2023.

Caucus Leadership: Walberg serves on <u>dozens</u> of caucuses including the School Choice Caucus, the Rural Broadband Caucus, and the Military Family Caucus.



Experience in Congress: Walberg has co-sponsored the Stronger Child Abuse Prevention and Treatment Act of 2019, (HR 2480); he co-sponsored legislation to raise awareness and support for adoption, and celebrate the children and families of adoption, by recognizing National Adoption Day and National Adoption Month; and he co-sponsored a measure to designate the week of Jan. 24, 2021 as National School Choice Week. Earlier this year, he was among a majority of Republican Members of Congress to call for disqualifying votes in the 2020 presidential election in several states, including Michigan. The Supreme Court rejected the case. Over the years, he's been a prime sponsor for nine enacted legislations related to accountability in federal grant making, safe disposal of medication, "Jessie's Law," an amendment to the Federal Powers Act, and the renaming of a federal post office.

Political experience: Walberg previously served in the Michigan House of Representatives (1983-1998).

Biography: Walberg was born in Chicago. Prior to his political career, he was a pastor in Michigan and Indiana, the president of the Warren Reuther Center for Education and Community Impact, and a division manager for Moody Bible Institute. He is a married father with three children.
